The Midwest Clinic is pleased to announce the appointment of John E. Clinton to the Board of Directors. John serves as Director of Fine Arts for the Norman Public Schools in Norman, Oklahoma. He received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1969 from East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, his Masters of Music Education from the University of Oklahoma in Norman, Oklahoma, and his Ph.D. in Music Education in 1991 from the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas. His dissertation, An Investigation of Self-Perceptions Certified Public School Fine Arts

Teachers Have Toward Their Roles as Artist and Instructional Staff Member, was nominated for the 1992 Council for Research in Music Education's Outstanding Dissertation Award. In 1999 and 2000, he received an Outstanding Music Educator Award from the National Federation of State High School Associations. In addition to his position with the Norman Public Schools, John is an Adjunct Professor of String Pedagogy at the University of Oklahoma and the conductor of the Oklahoma Youth Orchestra.

John Clinton replaces Dorothy Kunkel who retired from the Midwest Clinic Board of Directors in December 2000. Dorothy had served on the board since 1980. At the 2000 Midwest Clinic, she was awarded the Medal of Honor for her
