The Three Spheres

Musical

- Empowering students to explore diverse musical roles and identities, from performer to patron, fostering a deeper connection to the art form
- Developing leadership, creativity, and collaboration through peer-led ensembles and group improvisation experiences

Social

- Promoting meaningful student relationships through intentional community-building activities that foster friendship, empathy, and connection
- Encouraging inclusive collaboration by valuing diverse contributions and supporting teamwork in problem-solving and shared learning experiences

Operational

- Fostering student leadership and ownership through roles in concert promotion, merchandise design, sponsorship outreach, and executive council participation
- Supporting collaborative responsibility with hands-on tasks such as event setup, music distribution, instrument care, and classroom organization
