

# **How Students Control Tuning**

# **ALL INSTRUMENTS (general)**

- make the air column shorter(push the tuning mechanism in)
- make the air column longer (pull the tuning mechanism out)

#### FLUTE

- use more/faster air
- roll flute out
- direct air upward
- use less/slower air
- roll flute in
- direct air downward

### SINGLE REEDS

- use less air
- put more lower lip pressure on the reed
- use more air
- · put less pressure on the reed by dropping jaw

## **DOUBLE REEDS**

- use less air
- put more lower lip pressure on the reed
- put more reed into the mouth
- use a shorter bocal (bassoon)
- use more air
- put less pressure on the reed by dropping jaw
- put less reed into the mouth
- use a longer bocal

## **BRASS** (general)

- use more/faster air
- reduce the size of the embouchure aperture (tighten embouchure)
- use less/slower air
- increase the size of the embouchure aperture (loosen embouchure)

## **HORN** (additional)

- ↑ open hand in bell
- ↓ · close hand in bell


# **TROMBONE** (additional)

- make the air column shorter (pull slide in)
- make the air column longer (push slide out)

#### **BATTERY**

- increase head tension(tighten lugs)(push toe of timpani pedal down)
- decrease head tension(loosen lugs)(push heel of timpani pedal down)

# Seating Arrangement for the Young Band









Because of the many requests I have received, I have made available for purchase my **Chorales for Band**. There are currently eighteen sets in print, with each set containing five chorales. The contents of each set are listed on the following page.

These chorales are arrangements of simple four-part hymns. There are no dynamics, phrase markings or other indications on the scores or parts other than a few slurs. This was done to allow each director the freedom to use the material in a way that will best benefit his/her particular situation. I have found that having the students write in the various markings is very educational. In particular, the students have benefitted greatly from discussions about how to locate the phrase points.

The arrangements emphasize simplicity of scoring to facilitate the teaching of tuning skills. There is already a great wealth of elaborate band warm-up materials available through many publishers. I, however, have found the simple four-part hymn to be the best tool for teaching tone production, balance, and tuning to my own bands.

These sets are being marketed in a way different from most band music. The purchaser will receive a single copy of the score and each part in a set. The music teacher at the school making the purchase may duplicate as many copies as needed for the bands at that school. This permission to copy parts and score will remain in effect permanently — as long as the music is not shared with another school.

Because of the many requests I have received, I have made available for purchase my **Rhythms for Band**. It is a collection of common rhythms in both simple and compound meter arranged in a logical sequence to be used as daily exercises to develop rhythm reading skills.

Each new rhythm is written in a single measure as part of a column of related rhythms. The rhythms can be read either going down the columns of matching meters, or across the rows of changing meters. The rhythms can be performed on a single pitch, a single chord, or utilitizing scales. The more involved the director makes the pitch choice, the more complex the task will be for the students.

This booklet is being marketed in a way different from most band music. The purchaser will receive two copies of the rhythms. One copy will have each of the 19 rhythm sets on a letter size page, the other will have the same sets arranged in booklet layout on tabloid paper. The music teacher at the school making the purchase may duplicate as many copies as needed for the bands at that school.
