Understanding by Design (Wiggins and McTighe)

3 Stages = Backwards Design

- 1 = Goals, Outcomes (WHAT do we want students to know/do?)
- 2 = Assessments (HOW will we know when they've learned it?)
- 3 = Lessons, Activities (WHEN/WHAT/HOW do we plan to teach and re-teach?)

Essential Questions for this Session

What ARE the MCAs (or Model Cornerstone Assessments)?

- Standards-based formative and summative assessments embedded in instructional practices
- Authentic application of musical skills with established rubric-based evaluation tools
- Appropriate developmental assessments applied with increased rigor over time and grade levels

Why are the MCAs important to us?

- They provide evidence of student learning and achievement in process-organized teaching
- More than 50% of states have adopted/adapted the National Standards as their own
- · They address traditional and emerging ensembles via use of the Ensemble Music Standards

How are MCAs organized?

- Ensembles have five sequential proficiency levels, General Music has three at Grades 2, 5, 8
- MCAs are provided for each component of the three Artistic Processes at each of those levels
- Assessments are accompanied by suggested instructional sequencing and activities
- Student worksheets, self- and peer-evaluations, and performance rubrics are included
- Examples of leveled, scored student work are shared online

What might be YOUR entry points?

- Increasing familiarity and use of the National Music Standards
- Finding a scoring rubric for individual student performance
- Structuring peer feedback
- Aligning district assessments
- Empowering student choice
- Collecting formative/summative assessment data
