


Title 1 Band Logistics (aka FAQs)

What is Success?

- This may seem simple, but you can't succeed if you don't set a goal.
 - Use the S.M.A.R.T approach to setting goals
 - Specific: What exactly do you want?
 - Measurable: NOT "I want to be better"
 - Achievable: Make it realistic.
 - Relevant: How does this relate to your program and your kids?
 - Time-Bound: 3 weeks, 9 weeks, semester, year
- Create your Band's Culture
- Growth in numbers
 - Recruit! Recruit! Recruit!
 - Retention
- Region/District Band Competition
- UIL Concert and Sightreading Evaluation
- Programming Capabilities

- Why are you a music educator?


Maintain your Mental Health
