


On-site registration may be paid in cash or by check. Checks should be made payable to the Midwest Clinic. Credit cards are not accepted on-site.

### Band Concert Ticket Plan

hen you register, you will have the opportunity to select one of two ticket series. Each series will include tickets for eight band concerts. (Orchestra and jazz band concerts do not require tickets.) Throughout the conference, a ticket exchange booth will be open at the Midwest registration desk. If you have a ticket for a concert you do not plan to attend, we ask you to drop it off at the exchange booth. High school, middle school, and elementary school students will not be issued tickets.
